III. First International Rope-Skipping Workshop – Sept. 2014




VI. Second International TAFISA CLC – Sept. 2014

GTC - German Tours & Conferences, Hamburg - Germany (Hereinafter called GTC)

Preamble

Shree Hanuman Vyayam Prasarak Mandal, Amravati is proud to have long history of association with Germany. In the year 1928 Dr. Kokardekar was sent to Berlin University for completing his higher studies in physical education & sports and he spent 5 valuable years in Germany and developed great relations amongst the sports authorities due which the team of HVPM sportsmen could perform in the Berlin Ölympics in 1936. We hope the sporting and academic ties between HVPM and Germany shall grow stronger with this MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING, hereinafter called MOU with GTC.

Objective:

To jointly promote sports tourism through Indian traditional sports, games & physical culture in Germany and across Europe through the two institutions of HVPM; Degree College of Physical Education & College of Engineering & Technology by way of Academic collaborative, Faculty Development and Student internship programs and also by together creating & managing mega sports and entertainment events for the European sub-continent.

Terms & Conditions:

- Both the parties agree to cooperate with the spirit of mutual understanding and goodwill to strengthen their ties and sign this MOU for the period of next five years.
 - 2. On behalf of GTC, the Managing Director of the company Mr. Rolf Düngefeld has agreed to become Mentor for HVPM's College of Engineering & Technology's MBA Department in Sports Management, Sports Tourism and Sports Event Management. For the same he also agrees to personally visit the Department in the month of September every year and virtually meet the students and faculties

- in the month of January every year. He shall also suggest expert speakers on relevant fields and subjects who could either visit or virtually connect with the MBA Department as the case may be. HVPM shall also focus and push Sports Tourism syllabus in the current curriculum of Sports Management in the S.G.B Amravati University.
- 3. Eligible students if selected through a well defined process shall join GTC in Germany for a two month long Summer Internship Program in the months of June & July every year. They shall work for GTC on projects based into Sports Management, Sports Tourism and Sports Event Management for which GTC agrees to pay a daily allowance. Eligible students shall also be selected for executive placements in GTC.
- 4. A new sporting and entertainment event is to be conceptualized on the lines of "Fireworks of Gymnastics" to promote Indian traditional games, sports and culture across the European Union. The details of which are to be further discussed between HVPM & GTC and a project report on the same will be submitted by HVPM by December, 2013.
- 5. To promote HVPM as a sports tourist destination in India with a focus on providing packaged services to European tourists interested in Indian landscape, Yoga practices training and the traditional sports, games and culture. With further discussion a project report shall be sent by December, 2013 by HVPM.
- 6. With a view to develop the Faculties at MBA Sports Management Department at HVPM, GTC agrees to provide them hands on experience on relevant projects in the fields of Sports Management, Sports Tourism and Sports Event Management. Also, GTC agrees to support by way of exploring possibilities in University tie ups and Faculty exchange programs in Sports and Management institutions and Universities in the European Union.
- 7. All the financial requirements shall be met by mutually understanding on sharing basis, depending upon the services to be rendered, projects & assignments to be undertaken.



Gerlev Physical Education and Sports Academy is 90 kms North-West of Copenhagen in Denmark. HVPM and Gerlev have known each other since 1949. A contingent of athletes from HVPM along with the current Gen. Sec. Padmashri Prof. P. A. Vaidya went to Sweden to participate in the World Lingiard Festival, on their way to Sweden this contingent visited and demonstrated Indian physical culture and traditional games in Germany, France and Denmark. The 1949 memories came to life in January 2013 at the Global Conference held at HVPM, attended by representatives from 30 different countries. In his meeting with the Gen. Sec. on the subject of MoU, the Gerlev President Dr. Finn Berggren was astonished to see records of HVPM's visit to Gerlev in 1949.

As per the MoU, faculty and student exchange has been set as a priority and Mr. Lars Hazelton – Director, Gerlev Play-park has visited HVPM two years in a row with his valuable lessons in Danish traditional and minor games.

Dr. Finn Berggren has visited HVPM thrice respecting the invitations for various events.

Gerlev has a tradition of respecting and promoting cross-cultural activities on their campus, continuing this on the basis of Mr. Lars' recommendations two students from HVPM were offered scholarships to be on Gerlev for their autumn semester. Mr. Pushpak Khonde (BPE First year) and Mr. Tanaji Bayaskar (MP Ed. First Year) joined Gerlev from Aug to Dec, 2015.

Two faculties from HVPM were also invited to visit Gerlev, Prof. Ravi Sahu (Asst. Prof. & Head – Sports M.B.A Department) and Dr. Vasishtha Khodaskar (Yoga Expert and Asst. Prof. DCPE) stayed on

Gerlev campus with the autumn batch and learned the best practices through attending the semester classes as students for six weeks from 16th August to 2nd October, 2015.

Dr. Khodaskar promoted Yoga and meditation through sessions with the 110 students' batch coming from 11 different nations to attend the autumn batch. Prof. Sahu as a management expert observed and noted the best practices of Gerlev; an organization with high level of synergies with HVPM.

Another objective was to study the Gerlev Playship Project, a flagship Gerlev program clubbed with Danish corporate CSR on promoting physical activity and active living from harbour to harbour across the coast of Denmark.

Observations: -

1. The Leadership & Organization

Fortunately Prof. Sahu had many opportunities to personally discuss the all important subject of leadership with Dr. Finn Berggren – the President of Gerlev Physical Education & Sports Academy and Playpark. HVPM will always be thankful to Dr. Berggren for sharing his insightful knowledge and valuable time.

Finn as everyone addresses him on the campus has always believed in the people he has picked up for the job, hence he never interferes in their teaching styles or contents. *Gerlev philosophy is not just to teach sports but to teach through sports* — and once the right person matching this philosophy and other required skills is found then why do one really need to question daily affairs. This flexibility and freedom allows the staff to perform and achieve the common goals defined by the Gerlev management team.

- Meetings & Assembly

Every morning all the staff members from teaching, administration, maintenance and house-keeping join for breakfast at 10:00 up to 10:30. They casually discuss the routine affairs among each other, even are free to discuss urgent issues with Finn and get necessary approvals. Every Tuesday there is a teacher's meeting with Finn for a weekly report.

The maintenance and house-keeping meet every week and necessarily meet with Finn once every month.

The Monday morning assemblies are further important as Finn makes sure to address the students, otherwise due the busy travel schedule he finds it difficult to connect. The weekly schedule for major/minor subjects are well displayed in advance for the students. The kitchen duty charts are also made public for everyone to be prepared. To discuss students' issues the teachers and students forum meets post the Tuesday assembly. All the students are free to come up with complaints and suggestions respectfully and with democratic principles.

2. Teaching Staff

With respect to the major and minor subjects available in the autumn semester there are various teachers, some live on the campus and some off the campus. At Gerlev, you will meet a high number of employees from many different fields, sharing a passion for their individual work areas, and like to working at a school that sets a high professional standard. Working with people requires professionalism, curiosity and commitment. The list is as follows: -

i. Dr. Finn Berggren – President A visionary leader, steering Gerlev since 2002	
ii. Mr. Lars Mogensen – VP and Basketball A straight forward administrator with clarity of thought	
iii. Mr. Lars Hazelton – Director, Playpark One of the most vocal persons in the MoU, most lively Danish one can see. It's a bliss to the eyes seeing him engaging kids and adults in minor games and TSG. As Director of the play-park he has shared various valuable insights over challenges in Management of Sports.	
iv. Ms. Julie Hauge – Football & Philosophy A soft spoken introvert, with firm control over her duties	
v. Mr. Lars Studs – Arts & Music The creative brain behind keeping the fun alive on Gerlev.	
vi. Mr. Jo Kyrre Skogstad – Move-out/ Beach volley Very senior, very mature. One needs to know how he handles grave issues like racism on the campus head-on!

3. Administration Staff

The small administration team consist of four people. Most importantly there is Ms. Lizanne Durring, the one who takes care of all communications between HVPM and Gerlev for students and their visas. Then there is Mr. Handling the financial planning and accounts for Gerlev, on discussion it was shared how Gerlev manages Danish Government's grants and generates its own income to survive. NGOs in the sports sector are plagued by similar issues in terms of finance and policy neglect. Gerlev swimming pool is very small made as per the standards of the times in 1938, expansion will cost DKK 17 Million or Rs. 17 Crores (Indian), a sum too high to-raise anywhere in the world; especially for NGOs.

4. House Keeping

As a part of the culture the Danes are hygiene conscious people of the highest degree, and are known for it around the world. The story dates back to 1920, Tuberculosis epidemic surfaced and once the scientist understood spitting around was one of the major reasons for the spread they informed the people of Denmark. Since then most Danes started to look down upon people spitting or littering in public spaces. This social outcast made the population more aware of keeping their surroundings clean.

The five member house keeping team cleans most common places starting early morning 6:00 AM. They join the Gerlev staff for the traditional 10:00 AM breakfast every day. Post the first major class around 100 (Avg.) students as per their family groups collect cleaning equipments and go to their assigned area for cleaning the place every day between 12:00 to 12:15 PM. This includes the lobby, sports arenas, big and small gyms and even the lavatories. The kitchen is cleaned by the rotating students' kitchen team twice after both meals.

5. Maintenance

Another four member team covers all the maintenance of the whole schools' carpentry, plumbing, electricity and temperature control requirements. Under the leadership of Michael they meet every morning and make a list of complains and other pending maintenance works on the basis of urgency and importance. The list is taken care of and reviewed for the next day. Building maintenance, swimming pool and lawn is also covered by this small team with the help of all sorts of equipments. This team also meets the president once every month to discuss major repairs and issues.

6. What a Mess!

Hospitality and food is given due importance at Gerlev. Best quality and taste is served to students and guests alike. This is one of the major reasons for the satisfaction of students staying on Gerlev. Like all the other departments – teaching and non-teaching; kitchen also submits a budget in the start of the year and sticks to it. The students' kitchen team helps the kitchen staff in serving the food, washing dishes and cleaning. Major life lessons transferred here.

7. The Play Park

Keeping alive the traditional sports and games or the intangible cultural heritage of Denmark – The Play Park is a total fun filled area open for the general people of Denmark. Individual families and corporate hospitality is a common picture at the play park.

8. The Playship Project

A corporate CSR funded (Lauritzen Foundation, Denmark) 5 year innovative project hired a 64 year old heritage wooden ship to sail across Danish shore and spread the message of physically active living among young and old alike. The harbour city school and commune is intimated in advance of this ship arriving and major stake holders are gathered to discuss the prospects of developing their city into an active city instead of just becoming a concrete jungle.

1. Introductory Background

The relationship with the Ministry of Sports - Govt. of Sri Lanka and the National Institute of Sports Sciences, Colombo – NISS that works under the Ministry of Sports, Sri Lanka; commenced with the first visit of Dr.ArunKhodaskar – The Yoga Guru of HVPM.

In the year 2014 Dr.Khodaskar visited Sri Lanka for a Yoga workshop. While meeting the Sports Ministry officials he was directed to see to the Director and Registrar of NISS – the premier institution of the Govt. of Sri Lanka running the Diploma courses in physical education.

The yoga guru was well received by the Director Dr.ShanthaWeerwikrmasinghe and the Registrar Mr. SamanSamarkone at 20:00 hrs on the NISS campus. The discussions over HVPM and its glory impressed the NISS officials so much that they agreed to send a 20-member contingent along with four officials for a refresher course in physical education to HVPM, India.

On their maiden visit to HVPM the NISS contingent and officials were very impressed with legacy of 100 years and were also given a brief about MBA Sports Management department and the possibilities of a joint course. The continuous correspondence between Mr. RatnePathirane and Prof. Ravi Sahu (Head, MBA – Sports Management) finally brought an approval of the Sports Ministry in Sri Lanka which identified a need for a professional management course to the sports ministry officials like the Coaches, District Sports officers and sports officers from all nine provinces.

In Feb-March 2016 a proposal was invited by the NISS for a Short-Term Diploma in Sports Management with field visit in Amravati, 60 hours of Theory classes in Sri Lanka and online assessment in between the two. The budget and course design made by Prof. Ravi Sahu(Prog. Dirctor - DISM) is given for reference in the subsequent chapters of this report.

Upon agreement of the course design and budget, on 10th October, 2016 the 55-member Sri Lankan contingent landed in Nagpur (50 participants and 5 NISS officials). Till the 23rd October, 2016 the participants attended scheduled guest lectures from the sports industry entrepreneurs and experts.

They started by attending the mesmerising demonstration of traditional sports and games (TSG) by more than 3000 students of HVPM on the occasion of 4^{th} National TSG Festival on the eve of Dussera Festival on 11^{th} October.

They were given 10 group projects to work upon in groups of five each. Apart from field visits to DSO office, Amravati Univ., Dnyanmata High School and Ruth India Archery Equipment manufacturing facilities they even visited various other organizations in relation to their group projects to study the Indian scenario to be ultimately compared with the Sri Lankan status and system. More details of these 13 days will be covered in the chapter 4 of this report.

Most importantly the success of this venture can be gauged by the fact that the Sports Ministry allotted second batch of 30 students for the same course going on from April 2017 to September 2017.


10 Days Study Tour to INDIA:

I am pleased to inform you that UNESCO will convene an International Collective Consultation Meeting on the preservation and the promotion of Traditional Sports and Games (TSG) at UNESCO HQ, Paris, on 6 and 7 July 2017, to which you are warmly invited.

Considering that traditional sports and games form a significant part of the cultural heritage which should be safeguarded and promoted, particularly with a view to improving the quality of physical education and sport in education systems, the Collective Consultation will build on the work previously carried — out by UNESCO. This includes the desirability of drafting a Charter on the safeguarding and the promotion of traditional sports and games, and the creation of an international umbrella organization. Moreover, a World Sports Encyclopedia was successfully published in 2003.

Therefore, this Collective Consultation will address the following threefold approach:

- The opportunity for the elaboration of Policy Guidelines on Traditional Sports and Games essentially based on the provisions provided by the draft Charter of 2005;
- The opportunity for the establishment of an International Platform on Traditional Sports and Games;
- The update of the 2003 World Sports Encyclopedia and the development of an Online Worldwide Encyclopedia

HVPM - Views & Proposals at the UNESCO, July 2017

For over a century Hanuman VyayamPrasarak Mandal, Amravati (HVPM) has been promotingIndian traditional physical culture, sports and games amongst the youth of the nation, cultivating values of strength, integrity and patriotism.

Based on the UNESCO background over Traditional Sports & Games (TSG) since 1999, in the third meeting for collective consultation over safeguarding and promotion of TSG, HVPM came forward with an exhaustive proposal in sync with the synergies that it shares with the UNESCO initiatives.

The HVPM representative at the UNESCO – Prof. Ravi Sahu covered a brief historical sketch of HVPM since 1914. Depicting the hardships of two young founder brothers in the difficult days of British rule; joining hands with the freedom fighters for strengthening the young boys and girls for a strong society and strong nation. The vision of a 'world cosmopolitan university' of physical culture made it evident that HVPM has always been a future ready andprogressive organization.

With the help of a pictorial presentation*, it was brought to everyone's notice how HVPM has been promoting TSG through demonstration tours in India and abroad. The scholars going to Germany and Japan, participation and demonstration in the World Jamboree 1933 and Berlin Olympics 1936 along with other major tours in Europe.

Various activities HVPM has been involved in since 1924 like the Summer Camps in Indian TSG - teaching various TSG to young boys and girls coming from various parts of the country, Annual Dussera TSG Festival where more than 3000 students from all corners of India participate showcasing Indian physical culture like Mallakhambh, Dand-patta, Latthi-Kathi, Bhala, Dhal-Talwar, Vita-Phek, Madu, Kushti, Dand-Baithak, Yoga and folk dances like Lezim etc. Colourful pictures of all these activities kept the audiences mesmerised for the allotted 15 minutes of presentation. > The Challenges & Opportunities in TSG


- 1. Imbalanced local sports policy with disproportionate distribution of funds between elite Olympic sports and TSG promotion
- 2. Directionless NGOs with lack of concentrated efforts and no regional focus
- 3. Scholars, Researchers and TSG players find it difficult to access authentic study material and literature offline and online.
- 4. Low media space for TSG as compared to commercial sporting extravaganzas like Indian Premier League (Cricket) and Barclays Premier League Football.
- 5. Nearly no financial assistance from Government or private bodies
- 6. No attraction for Youth, keeping low participation and spectorship in TSG
- 7. Scattered TSG and its organization. Mostly TSG are a geographically small phenomenon, due to which the organizations working for TSGs are regional in nature and lack national or global presence.

Keeping these synergies, challenges and opportunities in mind the focus was shifted to the First TAFISA Regional Centre for TSG at HVPM, Amravati. Inaugurated in September, 2014.A glimpse of various activities taken under the centre were also highlighted. Under consultation with Mr. Wolfgang Baumann (Gen. Sec. TAFISA) the objectives and mission of the TSG centre were also brought forward, which are not different from the UNESCO's proposal of building an International platform for TSG.

The premise for HVPM's proposal of TSG promotion was made under Dr. S. H. Deshpande's TSG Model where the potential of TSG and the fall-outs of Elite sports are underlined.



As depicted in the above model how the elite sports are hijacking the major share of sports finances and media space to allure the audiences in becoming passive spectators – Sports for Classes, whereas TSG at the bottom of the pyramid are the sports for the common man – Sports of Masses.

- Effective Public (Govt.) & Private (NGOs) partnership in safeguarding through UNESCO pushing Governments for TSG.
- Minimal financial support as these organizations have most infrastructure and resources in place.
